Dear Families,

Holy Week and Easter Break! Points to remember:

- **We dismiss for the Break right at 3:00pm tomorrow, Friday.** Please make sure that whomever is picking up your child is aware in order to arrive on time. We've had a number of students left behind lately and we do not have supervision for them at all tomorrow. Also, please note that there will be parishioners and others observing Good Friday prayer in the church. Please respect their devotion and try to reduce any excess dismissal noise.
- **You are welcome to attend our Good Friday Stations of the Cross** in the church at Noon on Friday. There is no online sign up for this service, but it is first come, first seated until Covid capacity is reached. Best to arrive early to be assigned a seat.
- Friday is also **the last day we will be collecting food and clothing for our Lenten service project** benefitting St. Vincent de Paul and the Rainier Valley Food bank. A flyer is linked [HERE](#). Feel free to bring those items with you to Stations or at morning drop off.
- **No classes will be held next Monday - Friday** for our planned Easter Break week. School re-opens at 8:30am on Monday, April 12.
- A reminder that the Governor has rescinded his **inter-state travel ban** requiring a formal quarantine period after vacationing outside of Washington. It is still recommended by the CDC that non-essential travel is restricted. However, if you plan to travel **outside the United States** (Canada, Mexico, etc.) please know that the more regulated health quarantine remains. We will update this news as soon as any new guidance becomes available.
- I am working with our resources at the Archdiocese to help **finalize admissions for next year**. I have heard from two families who have run into related issues. While knowing that we do not have a direct say into what other schools decide, please know that we are serious when we say we are trying our best to help. Please email me directly if you run into any difficulties transferring to another Catholic school. When I know, I can look into what possibilities remain.
